PAASL Referee Assignments



PAASL and many area youth and adult clubs use the <u>PENSRA</u> referee assignment system for both league games & tournaments. Register and request or self-assign games for PAASL there.

PENSRA is a powerful and easy to use system that provides for the ability to SELF-ASSIGN matches based on a set of mandatory and conditional rules. PAASL will be offering approximately 25 games per week, during the evening weekdays and on Sunday, as well. Referees are expected to be independent and highly reliable. Late and/or no show, no call situations are dealt with harshly. We are paid professionals and our punctuality and follow-through are basic requirements and simple, standard business courtesies.

To secure assignments, be sure to:

- Secure a Grade 8 or higher USSF badge if not already in place
- Set-up a free PENSRA account
- Configure your PENSRA account with:
- Your Tax ID number (earnings of \$600 or more will generate a 1099 from PAASL)
- Your cell or other contact phone
- U.S. Postal Service mailing address
- The PAASL interest box checked in your PENSRA Referee profile
- Any other PENSRA -required fields (e-mail, etc.)
- Take and pass the PAASL League-specific test in PENSRA (not yet released; only about a dozen questions)
- Secure a (new) Adult rating in Pensra for your account (some initial ratings may be set in advance; we are working on this)

All payments will be processed through PayPal. Payments will be made by PAASL on a monthly basis. We are contemplating moving to twice-monthly payment schedule.

An ADULT rating has been added to PENSRA to facilitate rankings and ratings for adult matches. All PAASL referees will need to have these ratings established in the PENSRA system. Contact me to request rating changes.

Leverage self-assign as often as you possibly can. Read the PENSRA failure codes to determine why you can't self-assign. Use manual assign as the back-up. PAASL aims to release matches as early as possible.

While I appreciate all official's specific and unique needs and circumstances, please resist the temptation to contact me until after you have consumed all the terrific resources on this page, in PENSRA's FAQs and on <u>CNRA.net</u>.

limited responsibilities, to cover for AR2 in the event of an absence.
